San Diego-based nonprofit National Foundation for Autism Research (NFAR) hosts the 7th Annual San Diego Race for Autism. Nearly 5,000 people turn out annually for the 5K Run/Walk and 1-mile Family Fun Walk, which raises money for the development of innovative treatment programs and options that improve the quality of life for thousands of San Diego children with autism. The Race also serves as a "March to Awareness" for Autism Awareness Month in April.
